Dear Friends

Come to a Carol Service or a Christmas Eve Communion and you'll hear this read '*And the Word was made Flesh and dwelt among us'*. This is the heart of the Christmas Message; what God needed to tell us (his word to us) was put into a human life and lived out for all to see.

In schools now they commonly teach children to 'be the very best version of yourself you can be'. This phrase captures the Gospel in a nutshell. What you might call '*not* the best version of myself' the Bible calls 'sin' and being the 'best version of yourself' is what Christianity calls being 'Christ-like'. Every day of our lives we are choosing between different possible reactions we could have to whatever situations we find ourselves in. When you see the figure of the baby Jesus in a crib this Christmas, just imagine you can hear God saying, 'Watch this little life, this baby is going to show you the best version of what a human being can be; this is what being truly human means'. The best version of yourself is actually your True Self as God intended you to be: your Christ-like self.

Christmas literally means 'Christ Comes' and I often speak of how Christ comes to life within us. The world seems to be in a bit of a mess this Christmas. Lots of people are failing to be the best version of themselves. What about you? Merry Christmas.
